Treatments covered by CDBS are, teeth cleaning, check ups, x-rays, fillings, extractions, root canals and fissure seals.

Parents, guardians, approved organisations are encouraged to contact their Dental provider to access the Child Dental Benefit Scheme.

From The Dog House - with Brendan Butler

One of the first lessons we teach a young dog is to be tethered, and then to lead on a leash. Until the dog will lead around beside us in a relaxed state we are not going to have any control, and any further lessons are futile, because the dog will take no notice of us at all.

At the recent Gary White school, one of his favourite sayings was "who's in control, you or the dog" and if we want the dog to lead in a relaxed state beside us, then it has to be us, and not the dog in control. If the dog is trying to drag you up the street then sadly it is the dog and not you that is in control of the situation.

One of the first things we can do for a pulling dog is to stand with a short leash and get the dog to relax beside you. I carry a small piece of poly pipe or my trusty plastic garden rake with me in the other hand and when we go to walk if the dog pulls away, I give it a sharp tug back and put the rake in front of its nose.

At first we might have to tug quite hard and give it a sharp smack to let the dog know that this behaviour is not acceptable. As soon as the dog responds, we instantly need to give it some lead and let it relax. (Pressure on, pressure off.)

The dog will soon get to know , it is uncomfortable to keep getting checked and have a rake shoved under its nose and that it is much more comfortable to just walk casually beside us. Persistence is the key and the dog just has to learn that it is not going to get away with pulling you.

The rake is also handy to keep pushing the dog back on the side that it is supposed to be walking on, as it may want to keep going around to the other side of you.

If you want a well behaved pet ,YOU have to be in control.

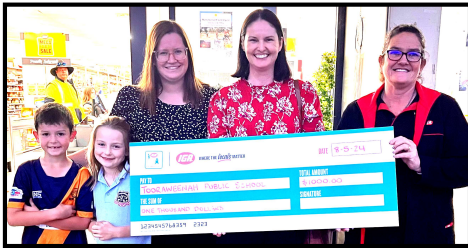

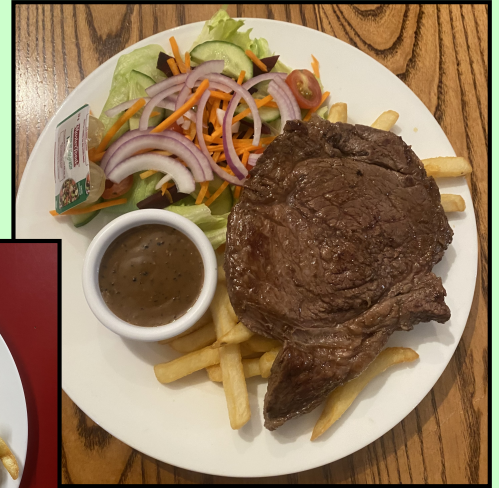


