

Tooraweenah War Memorial Hall-Can You Help?



The Tooraweenah War Memorial Hall committee is looking for information on a brass plaque that was found in Tooraweenah a number of years ago by Fred Rzeszowski. It was found when cleaning up in Garling Street. It was believed this was from the first hall in Tooraweenah prior to burning down, the second hall was on the current hall site in Bridge street prior to it burning down and the current hall is the third in Tooraweenah being built around 1930.

The Brass Plaque reads as follows; Tooraweenah Memorial Institute This land was the gift of Mr John Murray And the fence the gift of Tooraweenah Race Club. The Hall committee are aware of Mr John Murray's contribution to Tooraweenah with many legacies of land to community groups and a street being named after him and the building of the current day hotel.

The committee would like to know more about the Tooraweenah Race Club.

A number of locations for the race course have been nominated in conversation so far, such as Dooroombah, Greenwood, Rosehill and the Tooraweenah Show ground.

Gilgandra Film Festival




