

From The Dog House - with Brendan Butler



A couple of problems that crop up occasionally with young dogs that are just starting to get in a work situation, is that they are either too soft and watchful, or too hard strong and fast. Either traits can be frustrating and annoying for the stock handler.

A young dog that is too soft tends to be too careful on their stock and lacks the confidence to put pressure on the stock it is working, and the hard dog will work too close, fast, and be uncontrollable, thus causing mayhem.

So let's look at the pros and cons of the soft dog. A soft dog will want to cast out really wide and not put any pressure on the mob outside in the paddock and will be very unconfident in the yard situation. These dogs are not necessarily timid, but lack the strength, maturity and confidence to get in and get the job done. They usually have a lot of eye and tend to lay down and creep up on the stock, causing the stock to want to keep turning around and nervously watch the dog, instead of being intimidated and walking away. While a soft dog can Brendan Butler. be frustrating, all is not lost, as they often mature into smart dogs, with a nice feel for their stock, and make

excellent paddock, mustering and droving dogs, that don't upset the stock they are working, keeping the stock settled and just poking along. This can be a plus in a yard situation as well.

Encouragement, maturity, plenty of work and patience, are the keys to help build a young dogs confidence, and is one of the few times I don't mind working a young unsure dog with an older dog if it will keep stock movement happening.

In the yards, a drill to teach a walkup, is to tether a sheep at the end of a drench race facing out, and walk the dog on a leash towards the sheep till the dog gets restless, stop the dog and get it to relax, then back the dog up and repeat the exercise until we can get the dog to come comfortably closer. Eventually, we should be able to get the dog to walk right up to the sheep's face and hold its ground without being frightened. Happy mustering.
